Good People,

The word "Lent" comes from an old English word that means "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of Spring with their arrival of sunshine, warm weather, and the gradual greening of a brown winter world. From this point of view, we are all "keeping" Lent by the mere fact that we are living through this springtime season. Sitting with this understanding of Lent, the question becomes not one of whether to keep Lent – all of Creation keeps Lent – but how to keep it. What does Lent mean for each of us here and now, this spring, this March?

In the Early Church, Lent was the final culmination of a three year training and preparation program for baptism and entrance into the Christian life. By Late Antiquity and the Early Medieval period, Lent was less about new Christians entering the church and more about estranged Christians coming home. Post-Reformation, Lent now carries a more personal and interior meaning – a time of individual repentance and spiritual renewal...a sort of spring cleaning for the soul. Of course, for some of us, maybe many of us, Lent seems a mixture of all three. We encounter as if for the first time this astonishing God of Love and Mystery who continually invites us into greater and greater intimacy. We return to the God who sought us out before we even knew we were lost. And we prepare the Temple Within so that the Spirit of our Lord may enter with all grace and glory.

Rather than giving something up this Lent, I encourage us all to try something new, to develop a new habit. Perhaps it's some time in silent prayer at the beginning and/or ending of our day. Perhaps we might memorize each week the psalm from Sunday's worship. Perhaps we might spend time outside each day, moving our bodies and encountering the natural world, or at least the natural world in our neighborhood. Perhaps we might anonymously volunteer some time or money to a local arts or community organization. And most of all, we can be with each other more in church. We must all make this journey for ourselves, yet none of us can walk this way alone. I look forward to seeing you all at the Wednesday devotional lunches and the Lenten evening services. It's a privilege to be traveling with you all on this faith pilgrimage.

The Evangelism Team has identified who we want to target. We think the best opportunity to grow our Congregation is to seek out people who are relocating to the greater Charlottesville area but are already churched. Specifically, we think we should zero in on the Lake Monticello area and its surrounding communities, as well as the Spring Creek area. There are literally hundreds of people relocating to these areas with a good percentage of these folks close to or have already retired, and this is the demographic where you will find people who already belong to a church. Many of them will be or already are looking for a new church. That church could be Grace and Glory.

We are also reaching out by phone and in writing to our inactive members. The goal is to invite 100 people to our Easter service. That's where you come in. Lutherans typically are very squeamish when it comes to Evangelism. Louise Jargowsky shared this joke with the Evangelism Team: "What do you get when you cross a Jehovah's Witness with a Lutheran? Someone who will knock on your door and not say anything." Well, it's time to say something and we'll help you with the script. At our most recent Leadership Team meeting Helen Ida commented that Sue Pickett would say that the easiest way to start the conversation is to ask, 'Do you have a home church?' If no, then there's you opening. All you would have to do is hand them a card.

We are hoping that we could get each active member to hand out a total of 3 cards to a neighbor, friend, coworker, or God forbid, a stranger, inviting them to Easter service. The card will contain the invitation along with all the information they need to find us. You just need to give it to them. More to come.
